## *Murdering Marlowe* opens WEPG's 101<sup>st</sup> Season

ST. LOUIS, MO (November 2, 2011) – West End Players Guild opens its 101<sup>st</sup> season on Friday, November 11, with Charles Marowitz's *Murdering Marlowe*, directed by Robert A. Mitchell.

This year's opening night falls on WEPG's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday. A group of Washington University professors organized as The Players opened their first show on November 11, 1911, at the St. Louis Artists' Guild. The Artists' Guild building was located at Union and Enright, directly across the street from WEPG's home for the last 26 years, the Union Avenue Christian Church.

"The original members of The Players, we are told, enjoyed reading and performing the classics, and because of that we think they would have a lot of fun with our 101<sup>st</sup> season opener, *Murdering Marlowe*, a clever and literate take on the rivalry between Christopher Marlowe and William Shakespeare," said Renee Sevier-Monsey, president of WEPG. In the play, Shakespeare is an aspiring playwright desperate to make his mark in London. The greatest obstacle to his success is the prominence of Marlowe, the "superstar" of the Elizabethan theatre. This intriguing thriller explores the high price of envy, love and blind ambition, all played out among the familiar names of Shakespeare's day. *Murdering Marlowe* runs through November 20, with performances at 8:00 p.m. Fridays and Saturdays and 2:00 p.m. Sundays in the theatre at the Union Avenue Christian Church, 733 Union Boulevard.

David Wassilak appears as Robert Poley, Jim Hurley as Philip Henslow, Reynard Fox as Henry Maunder and Todd Moore as Ingram Frizer.
